
The Importance of Black History Month

I have decided to write about Ruby Bridges. Many people know of her, but don't know how much she paved the way for people of color. Ruby Bridges was just six years old when she first attended an all white public school. Frantz Elementary. Not only did she attend, but she was the first ever African American child to desegregate an all white school. The amount of Racism and prejudice she had to endure every single day just to attend school was ridiculous. This Woman is beyond worthy of Noble peace prize, without her, imagine how different schooling could be. Ruby bridges had to be escorted to school every single day because of how vile people were towards her. She had to walk past crowds of people yelling slurs at her, throwing rocks and stones, and threatening her. She claims one thing that really frightened her as a child was when she witnessed a white woman holding a black baby doll in a coffin. Parents went as far as pulling their children out of school just because she was there. Every single teacher except one refused to teach Ruby in their classroom, Barbara Henry. For the entire year she was a class of just 1 student. She didn't have any friends and would often eat and play by herself. The only person she would consider her friend was her teacher. Even with the loads of Racism she endured, she never missed one day of school. This six year old girl went through so much just to be able to receive an education. She was a child put through so much emotional trauma but still pushed forward and fought for change. Ruby Bridges family was put through so much just for wanting their child to receive a better education. Her father lost his job and many places refused to sell to her mother, but not once did they give up. I'm so heavily inspired by Ruby Bridges because I consider myself to be an activist and this woman has been an activist since six years old . I want to grow up to be strong minded, confident, and inspirational just like her. I often wonder how different school would be if she never stood her ground. Schools most likely would have stayed segregated for a long time. One part of this story that really resonates with me is that this all occurred in 1958. This only happened 63 years ago, it's extremely saddening to hear some people say " oh slavery happened so long ago", "Segregation happened way back in the day, get over it". Ruby Bridges is only 66 years old and is alive and well to tell her story. Change didn't come so easily and we still have many other issues to resolve. Racism and prejudice didn't just go away, the majority of people of color still experience it to this day. Facing micro aggressions, profiling, police brutality, assault and etc. It's better to be aware of the situations occurring than to be ignorant. Activism comes in many forms and Ruby Bridges is one of the many examples.


